**Enchanted Trail**  
October 21 & 22, 2016

Enchanted Trail is Audubon Arizona's annual fall festival. The event is intended to give visitors a greater appreciation for Arizona's nocturnal (night-active) wildlife through educational activities, live wildlife, and crafts. **This year's focal animals are the Coyote, the Pallid Bat, and the Western Screech-Owl.**

Each young participant will be given an **Enchanted Trail Passport** that will assign them one of the three focal animals (each animal corresponds to a sticker color). There are three questions in the passports - by answering them, participants will learn which animal they are!

## **Bat Cave:**

This is the very first station on the Enchanted Trail, so this is where visitors may need the most help understanding their passports. While in the bat cave, they will learn about **where their mystery animal lives**.

- In the bat cave, visitors will find three framed clues marked with paint the same color as the sticker on their passport.
- Each clue will tell the visitor where their mystery animal lives.
- Have visitors use their black lights to explore the walls of the cave until they find their clue.
  - **Western Screech-Owls** live in holes in trees or cactus
  - **Pallid Bats** in cracks and crevices in rocks, roofs, or flaking tree bark.
  - **Coyotes** live in the open under trees or brush. During the pupping season, they'll use a burrow or den
- Encourage participants to circle the correct answer for **question number 1** in their passport.
- Send visitors to the next station: the Critter Café where they will learn about what their mystery animal eats.
