Urban Hummingbird Program (K-5th)

Students learn fascinating facts about hummingbirds and discover ways to help hummingbirds in their own neighborhoods and how to participate in community science.

Downtown Owls Program (6th-8th)

Students learn the natural history about the world's only ground dwelling raptor, solve issues related to burrowing owls, and discover ways to help owls in their own neighborhoods and how to participate in community science.

Nature in Your Schoolyard (K-8th)

Students reexamine their campus as a place for not only students and staff, but a habitat for animals through three interactive STEAM stations: Guided Nature Outing, Birds of the Valley, and a Campus Habitat Redesign.
