The complex nature of species-species and species-environment interactions make predicting and describing the outcomes of these disturbances challenging. In this talk, Joe will use ecological and evolutionary applications to understand how drought in California has impacted grassland communities, how species invasions occur in disturbed habitats, and how we may need to consider more than just climate matching when thinking about the impacts of climate change.
